Dear Students.

In an effort to keep your account more secure we would like to inform you that multifactor authentication will be implemented February 5, 2024. Multifactor authentication is a process in which users are prompted during the sign-in process for an additional form of identification, such as a code on their cellphone.

If you only use one authentication method, for example a password, and your password is not strong, it will leave you vulnerable and could allow access if your password was exposed. When you use another method to authenticate, this will make it more difficult for an attacker to obtain or copy.

Multifactor authentication (MFA) works by using two or more of authorized methods

- Something you know, for example, a password
- Something you have, for example a trusted device that is not easily duplicated. This could be a phone, or a hardware key.
- Something you are biometrics

Available authentication methods which the college uses include:

- Microsoft Authenticator
- SMS

As of February 5th of 2024, we will be enforcing MFA on your college Microsoft accounts.

You can prepare for MFA now if you would like to enhance the security today.
