## Things to Do:

### 1. Uniforms

Uniforms can be purchased from a uniform retailer of your choice (Ex: Wear N Care – Windsor, ON) and can be found online (Ex: Amazon.ca). Uniforms, (**Ceil Blue scrubs**), will be worn throughout the two years of your education, including your clinical placements.

Students are encouraged to double check the fit of their uniform—assuring the ability to sit, bend, crouch, and reach, while maintaining proper coverage. Iron-on program patches stating you are a St. Clair College CVT student can be purchased from the Campus Bookstore. The patch is to be worn on the left-sleeve of the scrub top.

### 3. Clinical Placement Requirements

For information regarding clinical placement requirements and medical requirements, please visit the “PLACEMENT” tab on our program webpage. Clinical placement requirements MUST be completed by Second Semester – March 15th. The first clinical placement begins in May of the first year. If a student fails to meet the requirements, the student will not be allowed to attend clinical and may be significantly delayed while the conditions are being fulfilled. This could result in a grade of “unsatisfactory” for that semester. It is the student’s responsibility to ensure that all of the requirements are kept valid for the duration of the program. Students are responsible for all costs associated with requirements.
